

Morris D. Rosen Receives the Prestigious James Louis Petigru Award

Charleston, SC - December 15, 2011 - Morris D. Rosen, Esquire, founder of Rosen, Rosen & Hagood, LLC, was given the James Louis Petigru award by the Charleston County Bar Association at their annual holiday event. The award recognizes individuals who bring honor to the legal profession and is the highest recognition bestowed by the Charleston County Bar Association.

Rosen has maintained the highest professional rating in the Martindale-Hubbell Law Directory for more than 35 years. He served as the corporate counsel for the City of Charleston and is a member of the American College of Trial Lawyers, the South Carolina Trial Lawyers Association, the American Bar Association, and the Fellows of the American Bar Foundation. He has received the SC Bar Foundation's DuRant Award and has been named one of the Best Lawyers in America.
